



Below we've included photos of some Ford Transit Connects that we've designed, produced, or installed. Below each photo is a brief description of what the project entailed. As you can see from the photos, it's entirely possible to Partially Wrap your vehicle and still achieve the "wow" factor you're looking for. This is a great example of the minimal amount of graphics needed to let your clients know who you are and what you do. In most states, graphics like this are mandatory for commercial vehicles.



Here we have a design that was produced using solid-colored vinyl. Because nothing is printed, our client was able to save a lot on costs.



Adding a simple stripe-package really makes your vehicle stand out as a member of your fleet. You can either add solid, opaque graphics to the windows (as pictured above), or, you could add Window Perf graphics to the windows so passengers can still see out.



Because of their excellent fuel economy and the shape and design of the vehicle, more and more companies are choosing the Transit Connect as their fleet vehicle option.



Here we have a mix of digitally-printed images with solid-colored, die-cut vinyl. By cutting and placing individual decals like this, we're able to deliver "the look" of a Full Wrap for a fraction of the cost.



This is a great example of a Partial Wrap. The "flower" images at the bottom were all digitally-printed while the text was die-cut from solid black vinyl.



The graphics on the side of this Connect were designed to stay on there for the life of the vehicle. The digitally-printed portion on the rear is something this client swaps out from season to season as their marketing campaigns change.



Because of its popularity as a fleet vehicle, most Ford Dealerships should have a wrapped Transit Connect on their premises to show their clients the marketing possibilities of this vehicle first-hand.



This is a perfect example of how effective a Partial Wrap can be. To save on costs, we took the "bleed" from the sides and wrapped it onto the rear. Then, we added simple die-cut graphics to the empty areas. You can save hundreds by doing it this way.



Here we have a nice example of a Partial Wrap. The front-end and hood were left white to save on costs.



This is a perfect example of a Full Wrap. Notice how we removed the black molding piece that runs parallel with the ground on the sliding door to leave room for the text.



This is a great example of a Full Wrap. Notice how the bricks from the sides perfectly lineup with the bricks on the hood. This takes careful engineering and an installer who knows what they're doing.
